January 11th 2026 Sunday Baptism of the Lord Feast - Year A - Matthew 3:13 - 17

³⁻¹³Then cometh Jesus from Galilee to Jordan unto John, to be baptized of him.

¹⁴But John forbad him, saying, I have need to be baptized of thee, and comest thou to me?

¹⁵And Jesus answering said unto him, Suffer it to be so now: for thus it becometh us to fulfil all righteousness. Then he suffered him.

¹⁶And Jesus, when he was baptized, went up straightway out of the water: and, lo, the heavens were opened unto him, and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove, and lighting upon him:

¹⁷And lo a voice from heaven, saying, This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased.

- **Read and re-read** – out loud and slowly the Gospel.
- **Meditate** - on reading as being spoken to you, an experience in your life.

- **Pray** - Thanksgiving – Repentance – Petition.
- **Action** – Attitude (Call to change / to act /to do).

In this week's gospel we read about the Baptism of Jesus by John. John tried to dissuade him because he felt unqualified and unworthy of such a task because Jesus was greater than him. After some persuasion from Jesus, John gave in to him. Jesus told him "there is an important work of salvation going on at this time and I cannot stand aloof but must be part of it." He says that he must not lead 'from above' but by 'being with'.

When were the times in our lives when we felt we were being asked to carry out an important task but feelings of being unqualified or unworthy got in our way?

Prayer:

Thank You Lord for the times when we felt overwhelmed with troubles and it was as if we were drowning. We felt your love descending on us like a dove and we were able to stay afloat. We realised that you loved us and your favour rested on us.

Forgive us Lord for the times we did not follow the example of Jesus to lead by 'being with' and not 'from above'. This is why he invited John to baptise him because he did not want to be aloof but to be part of the renewal movement.

Help us Lord as your baptised people who you call to minister to others to be humble before you because we are your Beloved and your favour rests on us.
