January 7th 2024 Sunday Feast of Baptism of Our Lord – Year B – Mark1:7–11 Jesus wanted to be baptised. The river Jordan was a great river in Palestine, near Jerusalem and he decided this is where he would be baptised. It was no ordinary baptism, it was a baptism of repentance and for the forgiveness of sins. It was the moment that he joined in fellowship with those who were receiving baptism from John. In the same way he is in fellowship with us. By our baptism we are called to shape our lives as Jesus did, by practicing mercy, peace, justice and liberation to our family, friends and community. How do we do this in our lives?
