## Lectio Divina

## September 18th 2022 25th Sunday of Ordinary Time- Year C - Luke 16:1-13

<sup>1</sup>Then Jesus said to the disciples, "There was a rich man who had a manager, and charges were brought to him that this man was squandering his property. <sup>2</sup>So he summoned him and said to him, 'What is this that I hear about you? Give me an accounting of your management, because you cannot be my manager any longer.' 3Then the manager said to himself, 'What will I do, now that my master is taking the position away from me? I am not strong enough to dig, and I am ashamed to beg. 4I have decided what to do so that, when I am dismissed as manager, people may welcome me into their homes.' 5So, summoning his master's debtors one by one, he asked the first, 'How much do you owe my master?' 6He answered, 'A hundred jugs of olive oil.' He said to him, 'Take your bill, sit down quickly, and make it fifty.' 7Then he asked another, 'And how much do you owe?' He replied, 'A hundred containers of wheat.' He said to him, 'Take your bill and make it eighty.' 8And his master commended the dishonest manager because he had acted shrewdly; for the children of this age are more shrewd in dealing with their own generation than are the children of light. <sup>9</sup>And I tell you, make friends for yourselves by means of dishonest wealth so that when it is gone, they may welcome you into the eternal homes. 10"Whoever is faithful in a very little is faithful also in much; and whoever is dishonest in a very little is dishonest also in much. 11 If then you have not been faithful with the dishonest wealth, who will entrust to you the true riches? <sup>12</sup>And if you have not been faithful with what belongs to another, who will give you what is your own? <sup>13</sup>No slave can serve two masters; for a slave will either hate the one and love the other, or be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and wealth."

- Read and re-read out loud and slowly the Gospel.
- Meditate on reading as being spoken to you, an experience in your life
- Pray Thanksgiving Repentance –
  Petition
- Action Attitude (Call to change / to act /to do)

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In this week's gospel Jesus invites us to make definite choices about which master to follow in our lives. Each of us are stewards of the gifts God has given to us and he gently reminds us that we have a great responsibility to use these gifts wisely. Jesus also reminds us that God like the merciful master is generous and compassionate and he will set us free and give us the ability to value the support we get from others when living is hard.

What are the things we value most in life? Are power, popularity and influence important to us?

## Prayer:

Lord thank you for the free spirited people you sent into our lives helping us to know that it is always people who must come first, not power and influence.

Forgive us Lord for the times when we allowed ourselves to let our lives be taken over by our valuables and possessions letting them be our main pre-occupation.

**Help us Lord** to be people of light helping those weighed down by life's burdens to know they have support if they trust in your care and compassion.
