November 6th 2022 32nd Sunday of Ordinary Time – Year C – Luke 20:27-38 ²⁷Some Sadducees, those who say there is no resurrection, came to him ²⁸and asked him a question, "Teacher, Moses wrote for us that if a man's brother dies, leaving a wife but no children, the man shall marry the widow and raise up children for his brother. ²⁹Now there were seven brothers; the first married, and died childless; ³⁰then the second ³¹and the third married her, and so in the same way all seven died childless. ³²Finally the woman also died. ³³In the resurrection, therefore, whose wife will the woman be? For the seven had married her." ³⁴Jesus said to them, "Those who belong to this age marry and are given in marriage; ³⁵but those who are considered worthy of a place in that age and in the resurrection from the dead neither marry nor are given in marriage. ³⁶Indeed they cannot die anymore, because they are like angels and are children of God, being children of the resurrection. ³⁷And the fact that the dead are raised Moses himself showed, in the story about the bush, where he speaks of the Lord as the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob. ³⁸Now he is God not of the dead, but of the living; for to him all of them are alive."

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November 6th 2022 32nd Sunday of Ordinary Time – Year C – Luke 20:27-38 We see in this week's gospel the Sadducees set out to trick Jesus yet again. Jesus encounters opposition many times during his ministry. Jesus is in Jerusalem knowing that he is about to be arrested and condemned by the leaders of his own people and abandoned by his closest associates, but is still self possessed and trusting. In his encounter with the Sadducees he is not merely teaching but bearing witness to his own faith in the resurrection. When asked "whose wife will she be?" Jesus replies "she was never just 'somebody's wife", she was a person in her own right. When we die we are who we are when we lived first of all, sons and daughters of God. Even if we have failed in this life or did not receive due recognition from our fellow human beings but continued to live – true to the best of ourselves, we are alive in the eyes of God. Who are the people in our lives who have helped us by word and example to understand these things?
