- Meditate on reading as being spoken to you, an experience in your life
  Action Attitude (Call to change / to act / to do)

## March 10<sup>th</sup> 2013 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Lent – Year C – Luke 15:1-3; 11-32

In this week's gospel we have two parts. In the first we see Jesus, the tax collectors and sinners who are outsiders in the community and we also have the Pharisees who complain. In the second half we have the parable of the Prodigal Son which is one the most touching passages of the gospel. It is also the longest parable. In this parable we have three people. The father is the symbol of perfect love. We see this when the younger son asks for his share of the property; when the younger son returns; when he goes out to meet the older son. The younger son is in four parts; his original choice; the result of that choice; his movement towards repentance and his return home. The older son is also very important. He feel very angry because he has worked all his life on the farm and feels that his brother who left is more appreciated but the father reassures him that he too is very special to him.

As we read this gospel where do we see ourselves? Are we the ones who complain or do we feel we are the outsiders? Are we like Jesus who understands all? In the Prodigal son who do we relate to – the father or one of the sons?
