**Pope Leo XIV** - On this Good Shepherd Sunday, we welcome with prayerful hearts our new Holy Father Pope Leo XIV, who has been called by the Holy Spirit to shepherd us in our response to the love of our saviour Jesus Christ. We will all get to know the Holy Father and know more about him in time. He is the first North American Pope, a native of Chicago, his formation was in the tradition of the Augustinian Order, and he was appointed Cardinal by Pope Francis in 2023. He served as a missionary bishop in Peru for 20 years, and most recently has been Prefect of the Congregation of Bishops in the Holy See. The new Holy Father's choice of papal name is very, very noteworthy, as his same-name predecessor, Pope Leo XIII was known as 'The Social Pope', 'Pope of the Worker', saw Social Justice as a vital mission of the Church, and had deep devotion to Our Lady and the power of her prayer with and for all Gods people. May the Holy Spirit guide, enlighten and protect Pope Leo XIV and may each of us be graced to pray for him.

### **READINGS**

**A reading from the Acts of the Apostles (Acts 13:14.43-52)**

*Paul and Barnabas carried on from Perga till they reached Antioch in Pisidia. Here they went to synagogue on the sabbath and took their seats. When the meeting broke up, many Jews and devout converts joined Paul and Barnabas, and in their talks with them Paul and Barnabas urged them to remain faithful to the grace God had given them. The next sabbath almost the whole town assembled to hear the word of God. When they saw the crowds, the Jews, prompted by jealousy, used blasphemies and contradicted everything Paul said. Then Paul and Barnabas spoke out boldly, 'We had to proclaim the word of God to you first, but since you have rejected it, since you do not think yourselves worthy of eternal life, we must turn to the pagans. For this is what the Lord commanded us to do when he said: I have made you a light for the nations, so that my salvation may reach the ends of the earth.' It made the pagans very happy to hear this and they thanked the Lord for his message; all who were destined for eternal life became believers. Thus the word of the Lord spread through the whole countryside. But the Jews worked upon*

*some of the devout women of the upper classes and the leading men of the city and persuaded them to turn against Paul and Barnabas and expel them from their territory. So they shook the dust from their feet in defiance and went off to Iconium; but the disciples were filled with joy and the Holy Spirit. The word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God.***

**A reading from the book of the Apocalypse. (Apo 7:9.14-17)**

I, John, saw a huge number, impossible to count, of people from every nation, race, tribe and language; they were standing in front of the throne and in front of the Lamb, dressed in white robes and holding palms in their hands. One of the elders said to me, 'These are the people who have been through the great persecution, and because they have washed their robes white again in the blood of the Lamb, they now stand in front of God's throne and serve him day and night in his sanctuary; and the One who sits on the throne will spread his tent over them. They will never hunger or thirst again; neither the sun nor scorching wind will ever plague them, because the Lamb who is at the throne will be their shepherd and will lead them to springs of living water; and God will wipe away all tears from their eyes.' The word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God.**
